### **Inclusive Playground Coming to Sherwood**

I am thrilled to announce that the funding for the improvements to the City Hall playground adjacent to the Thornhill Pool has been approved by the A&P Commission!

This is a significant step forward for our community as we work to make our city more inclusive and accessible to all residents. This is an area that needs more playgrounds. Currently, the area has ample parking, bathrooms that are ADA-compliant, and other amenities that families can enjoy. The new playground will be an all-inclusive space, featuring a pour-play base that not only makes it maintenance-free but also much easier for individuals in wheelchairs to navigate. It's designed to cater to children of all ages and abilities, ensuring that everyone can play together and enjoy the benefits of outdoor recreation.

I extend a huge thank you to the A&P Commission for their generous funding of this project. Their support is invaluable in making Sherwood a better place for everyone to live, work, and play. This inclusive playground, situated in the heart of our city, will provide a range of play elements, including swinging, sliding, climbing, brachiating, spinning, and balancing. Let me walk you through some of the key features:

- Swing Set: Featuring an expression swing for toddlers and their caregivers to swing face-to-face, fostering essential emotional bonding during play. Additionally, a 5-12 Zero-G swing allows children requiring additional support to swing alongside their friends.

Also, this playground is designed to be a National Demonstration Site (NDS) for Inclusion, exemplifying evidence-based best practices in design and implementation. NDS sites support health-related initiatives and provide meaningful ways for community stakeholders to gather data about the site's impact on the community.

We anticipate breaking ground on this exciting new project in about eight weeks and estimate completion at the end of October. We will continue to update the community on the progress on our Facebook page @ City of Sherwood Arkansas - Government

Let's continue working together to make Sherwood a welcoming and inclusive community.


## MEET OUR MAY MUSICIANS

# ROCK REGION METRO MICROTRANSIT COMING TO SHERWOOD



The City of Sherwood is excited to announce the launch of its first within-city public transit service this summer through an agreement with Rock Region METRO. This is a newer type of service to the public transit industry called microtransit, or on demand, service.

## What Is Microtransit Service?

Microtransit service is a ride-hailing, ride-sharing transportation service that uses smaller, multi-passenger vehicles (such as vans) to transport passengers from any origin point to the destination point within the zone. The service is similar but different from private ride-sharing transportation services such as Uber Pool by Uber, which offers riders a cheaper trip fare by combining trips with fellow commuters heading in the same general direction; riders agree to have a more deviated path and more time added to their trip to accommodate such deviations in exchange for the lower fare.

METRO microtransit service will provide shared-ride trips for a low fare of \$2 per person per trip. Unlike private transportation networks, though, METRO microtransit service is limited by geography (trips will only occur within the zone, which is roughly similar to the Sherwood city limits) and time frame (service will operate Monday-Saturday, 6 a.m.-6 p.m.). Riders can use the service for any reason – trips to the grocery store, work, health appointments, coffee meetups, and more. Any member of the public, including residents and visitors, is eligible to ride. The METRO Connect Sherwood microtransit service is a handicapped accessible service.

## What About the Former Express Bus Route to Little Rock and North Little Rock?

Many Sherwood residents will remember the former Route 36 Jacksonville/Sherwood Express that provided public transit service for a few trips to downtown Little Rock in the mornings and a few

return trips in the evenings. As part of the R.I.D.E. 2020 – or Route Innovation, Development and Evaluation 2020 comprehensive operational analysis project that kicked off in Fall 2019, Route 36 was slated to be removed due to low ridership and high operational costs. At some point, the public transit advocates in Central Arkansas hope a more frequent, viable public transit commuter connection can be made among Pulaski County's suburban cities to the downtown urban core. This within-city service is a stepping stone to make the case for the need for such connections and find sustainable ways to fund them.



## Sounds Great! How Can I Get More Information About the Launch, Zone Map and More Details?

After awaiting vehicle delivery, the city and METRO teams are working hard to prepare for a service launch, which is dependent on hiring additional drivers. If you're interested in becoming a driver, visit the Careers page at [rrmetro.org](http://rrmetro.org). ### A TASTE OF MEXICO & CENTRAL AMERICA IN SHERWOOD


Since its beginning, Mercado El Valle has become an important part of the Sherwood community, offering residents a taste of Mexico and Central America right in their own backyards.


